

Program Requirements

We encourage member organizations to nominate representative visiting scholars whose research interests coincide with APARC's research agenda. Nominations from affiliate organizations are requested by February.

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION

Our program schedule mirrors the Stanford academic calendar, beginning in September and ending in June. Visiting scholars are required to be in residency during this time and be active participants in both program and center activities. To successfully maintain good standing in the program, regular attendance at designated activities is required. In addition to advancing their own projects, visiting scholars are encouraged to share their experience and knowledge to contribute to the center.

RESEARCH PROJECT

Each participant designs and conducts a research project throughout the academic year, submits progress summaries and a final report, and gives an oral presentation about the project to the APARC community.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Participants must have adequate command of English to make the most of their experience, as all communication and instruction are conducted in English. An official test score from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) of 89 or higher, or from an equivalent test, is required for admission. This requirement can be waived if the participant has earned an advanced degree at an English-speaking institution, or based on an interview with the program manager.

FEE

Organizations affiliated with the program pay an annual fee that covers basic research and administrative expenses of their representatives and supports program and center research and other activities.

ON-LEAVE POLICY

To take part in the Global Affiliates Program, participants must maintain ongoing affiliations with their sponsoring organizations and be on leave for the duration of their time at Stanford.

The Global Affiliates Program (GAP) at Stanford University's Walter H. Shorenstein Asia-Pacific Research Center (APARC) connects experts and leaders from the Asia-Pacific region with Stanford and Silicon Valley peers to advance U.S.-Asia partnerships. Through collaborations with public and private sector organizations, the program fosters dialogue, knowledge exchange, and long-term institutional ties that advance a shared understanding of affairs in Asia and U.S.-Asia relations.

Each year, affiliated organizations nominate a cohort of representatives to join APARC as visiting scholars, where they become part of a dynamic community focused on addressing the Asia-Pacific's critical challenges.
